Following our early reading and phonic meetings for parents of Reception and Year 1 pupils, we would like to promote the Phonics page on our school website. The actions are taught when new sounds are introduced and help the children to remember the sound by creating a physical memory of the sound. The children therefore learn the sound and letter visually, orally and physically.


