A big thank you to all the parents and carers



The children have settled in really well and are already beginning to adjust with confidence and enthusiasm. Your support plays such an important role in helping make this transition a smooth and positive experience for everyone—thank you again for being part of it!

Lockdown

This week, we carried out a lockdown practice as part of our safety procedures. These drills are an important way of making sure everyone knows what to do, just as we do with fire practices. To help the children understand in a calm and reassuring way, we explain lockdowns using the simple example of an animal on the school premises. The practice went very smoothly, with children sitting quietly at the front of the class while teachers checked everyone was present and read a story. Meanwhile, the Senior Leadership Team confirmed that all pupils and adults were accounted for before ending the drill after 4/5 minutes. The children responded really well and we are pleased that the process felt calm and routine.

School Penalty Notices for Attendance are **Changing from August 2024**

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into effect for all those issued after 19th August 2024.

Per Parent, Per Child

For Example: 2 siblings absent for leave during term time would result in <u>each</u> parent receiving 2 separate Penalty Notices.

First Offence

Second Offence

be £160 per parent, per child when paid within 28 days.

Third Offence

absence in a 10-week period

These Absences can be late after regist iuthorised Absences and Unauthorise ive absences. They can also be a com any of the above.


