#### School Penalty Notices for Attendance are Changing from August 2024

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into effect for all those issued after 19<sup>th</sup> August 2024.

#### Per Parent, Per Child

parent, for <u>each</u> absent child.

For Example: 2 siblings absent for leave during term time would result in <u>each</u> parent receiving 2 separate

#### First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Irregular Attendance or leave in Term Time the amount will be £160 per parent, per child when

paid within 28 days.

This is reduced to £80 if pai

#### Second Offence

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Irregular Attendance or leave in Term Time the amount will be £160 per parent, per child.

#### Third Offence

(Within 3 yes

The third time a Penalty Notice is issued for leave it Term Time or irregular attendance, the case will be presented to the Magistrates Court, where fines of to £2500 per parent, per child can be imposed.




